Working methods

- Every group worked on 2 types of farms :
 - Backyards for all 3 groups

- Commercial farms, but for 2 out of 3 groups only small to medium ones (for instance in one group, considering only farms without private contract, in another the size of the farm in pigs nb.)
- For all, all the grid items have been screened; most of them were kept.
- But no time to define a scoring method



Common ground...

- Good level of biosecurity should be observed for commercial farms:
 - who apply to an official certification (Good Husbandry Practices in KH, or disease-free est. In VN);
 - who are in contracts with pig companies (private standards).
- For others (backyards, and may be small-scale farms):
 - more difficult to regulate (and to control?) biosecurity
 - More difficult to observe some biosecurity measures (on transport, disinfection, changing of clothes for instance)
 - recommandations are given (no penalties), by leaflets, advice from village workers or sellers
- In all countries, no penalties applied (only by recommandations, persuasions)

...but some differences

On the regulatory framework:

- In Lao, a regulatory text regarding biosecurity in all type of farms (for poultry, pigs, etc.), prior to 2019;
- In KH, a proclamation (549) but applying to farms applying for GHP approval
- In VN, only for farms applying for free-disease certification, a circular n°24 with 21 points (some of them on the biosecurity plan)

About the tools used to assess:

- No grid in Lao and KH
- In VN a form used to assess compliance with circular 24 (but few and wide points, regarding biosecurity plan)

Focus on backyard items

3 out of 4 countries considered some biosecurity measures should/must be mandatory (between 5 and 12 items). Not the same but common measures for at least 2 countries :

General organisation of the farm:

- Continuous delimitation/fencing (2)
- No entry of unauhtorized people or vehicule in the farm (3)

Entry facilities:

- Presence of an antry facility or at least equipement to wah hands and change clothes (3)

Feeding and water:

- No pig ingredient in pig feed (3)
- No kitchen waste (or at least heated) (3)

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
